

Employment Preparation Certificate

The Employment Preparation Certificate is a full-year certificate program that runs from September to August and assists you in preparing for competitive employment and community living. It combines on-campus instruction with community-based work practicums. You will work with an Employment Specialist who will provide assistance on the work site.

The program assists you to:

- · develop a vocational choice/goal
- · improve skills for getting and keeping a job
- · improve job-related and personal organizational skills
- · develop positive attitudes and habits necessary for successful employment
- · enhance social skills
- · manage a more independent lifestyle




Youth Health Centre
